Comment: I write to express my concerns on this proposed development. As has been highlighted in comments here, the proposal is for a high number of apartment dwellings, which bring little to the development of Woking town centre and the work already done with Victoria Square, nor enhance the residential community of the local Goldsworth Road area. The height of the proposed blocks dwarfs local shops and homes and will cast a grey shadow over the local area, and detracts from the work achieved in Victoria Square.

The proposal seems to have little reference to a coordinated plan for the development of Woking, which should be aiming to create a town and community that is enjoyed by residents and attracts business and commerce. History has been witness to the negative social impact of the uncoordinated building of high rise tower blocks on inner cities. We live in a world of change; much of this we are unable to control, which is why it is vital to ensure the decisions we can control are informed and lasting.
